Things to know when storing items

You are responsible for insuring the contents of your unit

- We highly recommend insuring your items.
- Many homeowner policies already cover personal storage. Check with you agent.

You are responsible for your own pest and rodent control

• **DO NOT STORE FOOD.** Dry goods and similar products attract rodents and pest.

Dust will get into everything that is not sealed or covered

- Tape and seal all boxes
- Use old linens or other fabrics instead of plastic to cover mattress and box springs and fabric furniture. This will allow the fabric of the stored item to breathe more.

Under no circumstances should you keep anything flammable or combustible in your storage unit.

• This means no gasoline, oil, cleaning fluids or paint thinner etc... If you store any equipment that runs on gas be sure to drain the tank before storing.

High humidity days could form condensation on the concrete floors.

- Leave a space between items and the unit wall to allow air circulation within the unit.
- Store items in plastic tubs.
- Lay plastic sheeting on the floor.
- We do not recommend setting cardboard boxes on the concrete floor because the cardboard will absorb moisture and condensation.
- Charcoal is effective for odor control.
